MEDIUM-TERM OUTCOMES

What we'll do by 2027

- Increase the diversity of community and visitors engaged in the health of the catchment.
- Increase the diversity of land managers engaged in projects to improve the health of the catchment.
- Identify and provide mentoring and training to 25 new and emerging local NRM leaders.
- Identify opportunities to support and promote 50 local NRM leaders to influence decision-making at a range of scales.
- NRM related boards and advisory groups are representative of the diverse community.
- Improve the capacity of existing and new community groups and organisations to be involved in NRM and act on-ground.
- Form 5 partnerships with new sectors that attract resources and investment for community-led action.
- Provide new opportunities to build the capacity of a range of community members be involved and act on-ground.
- Increase the opportunities for volunteer participation by 25% with the adoption of new models of volunteering.
